OUR 1982 BENEFICIARIES

The Guide movement started in 1910 and since then it has become the biggest and happiest free association for young people anywhere in the world. Girls join the Brownies at 7 years of age, and at the age of 10, about 80% of these become Girl Guides where they learn all types of skills and crafts. "Be Prepared" is their motto, and this continues to be a challenge to all in the movement to overcome and beat life's emergencies, turning tragedy into triumpli. This way girls can prepare themselves for all life's experiences.

Shaftesbury Guiding started in 1943 and over the years has built up a District of four Brownie Packs, two Guide Companies and a Ranger Unit for the more senior members. A total membership of around two hundred, which is no mean feat for a small town with more and more coming into the movement.

Camping is part of the Guides' activities which is challenging and gives the girls an opportunity to think and do things for themselves. Both Shaftesbury Guide Companies camp every year in tents that date back to the 1920's. These need to be replaced, and extra equipment is also needed in order to cater for the bigger camps. The tents and equipment, when not in use by the guides, is loaned out to other youth organisations, so it therefore helps the whole community.

The Carnival Committee made a small contribution to the Guides' Camping fund last year and will be helping them again in 1982, together with donations to the newly formed Shaftesbury Hilltop Majorette Troupe and the proposed new Pavilion for the Sports Complex at Shaftesbury's new Upper School.

It was while on first aid duty at Springala that she entered for Carnival Oueen.

Bridie was educated at Christys School and now works in a local shoe shop. Besides first-aiding, her other interests are walking, reading, and playing badminton.

Bridie's attendants are Belinda Lopez (20) and Mandy Scammell (19), both are from Shaftesbury. Her Page Boys are David Merefield (6) and Christopher Hargrave (6) also from Shaftesbury.

The first Shaftesbury Carnival Queen reigned in 1931, but because there were no carnivals held between 1939 and 1945, our present Queen is the 45th.
