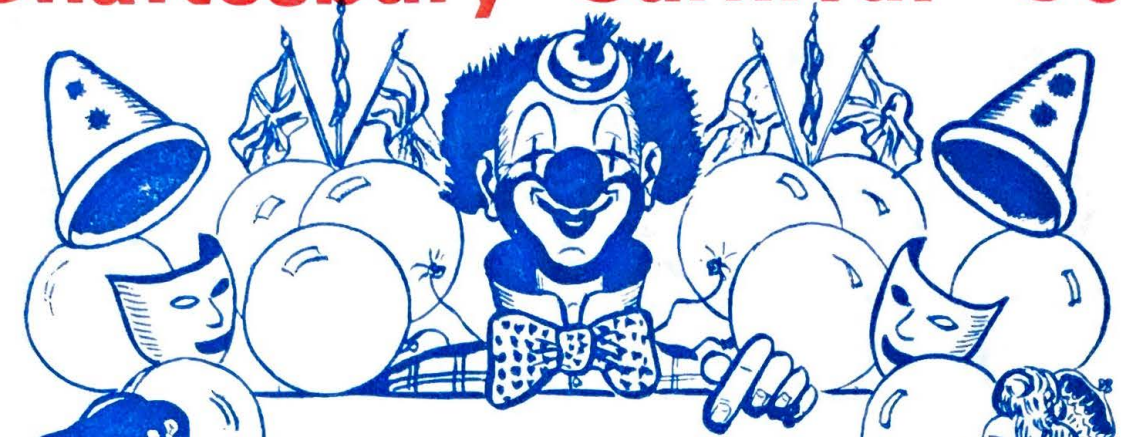

SHAFTESBURY ARTS CENTRE APPEAL

In 1952 the Old Market Hall in Bell Street was converted into a permanent Theatre and Arts Centre. This now successfully caters for a wide variety of artistic tastes and provides a pleasant meeting place for the people of Shaftesbury and the neighbouring area. At present there are over five hundred members who are able to take part in a wide variety of activities such as drama (adult and junior), Choral music, Art, Poetry, Bridge and Yoga.

Its events, widely supported last year by more than 5,500 people, include concerts which are often graced by performers of international repute, while varied exhibitions are held in the beautiful newly appointed gallery.

Development of the Centre now requires improvements, both to the fabric and to the amenities. Insulation and heating, together with general maintenance are needed; a new attractive foyer and front is planned which will be an asset to the town and worthy of the fine work going on within the building.

To finance the necessary improvements some £20,000 needs to be raised. The Arts Club launch its appeal for this sum in full confidence that the Arts Centre will become one of the finest in the West Country and a joy and pride to Shaftesbury.

'POLYSPHERE' FOR SHAFTESBURY PRIMARY SCHOOL'S SWIMMING POOL

A victim of the Government's cut-back in Local Authority spending the cost of heating the swimming pool at Shaftesbury Primary School now has to be paid for by funds raised locally by the Parent Teacher Association.

Swimming is now considered an important part of the physical education programme, providing a pleasant form of exercise and recreation which gives the individual a sense of achievement, not to mention the advantages of one being able to save oneself or others from drowning in an emergency.

At Mampitt's outdoor Pool, which is also shared by pupils from St. James and Enmore Green, children are introduced to swimming at the age of five. The water temperature must be maintained at around 80°F if these young children are to become confident in the water.

The Parent Teacher Association is striving to raise funds by holding various money raising events throughout the year in order to keep the pool in use. Being energy conscious, and to help cut down on future heating bills, they now hope to purchase a 'POLYSPHERE'. This is a large type of plastic bubble which is held over the Pool by air pressure, and which will maintain the temperature of the water during the summer months at around 70/80° without any additional heating. This will also help to extend the swimming season at the School.

TWO BANDS — new this year to Shaftesbury Carnival

POOLE SEA CADET BAND was formed in 1976 by Chief Petty Officer S. C. C. Wiseman. The Band has been successful at the Southern Area Sea Cadet Band Contest in 1976, 1977 and 1979, and several members have won various solo awards.

This year at the National Sea Cadet Band Championships at Blackpool, the solo drummer won the National Solo Drummer’s Award.

Twelve members of the Band are also Southern Area Guard and Pulling Champions.

The 37th KINGSWOOD SCOUT GROUP BAND from Bristol was founded by Scout Bandmaster Derek Beek as a Trumpet and Drum Band, later changing to piston bugles and now to 3-valved trumpets, Fugal Horn and Trombone.

They have taken part in many championships over the years at various venues throughout the country and on occasions have met with some success. They are current holders of the 3rd place trophy in the ‘Brass’ class of the National Scout Band Festival. The Band has recently appeared at Plymouth, taken part in the Bristol Flower Show, given a Scout Band Spectacular at the Bristol Colston Hall and also appeared in the 1978 Avon Gang Show at the Bristol Hippodrome.

The 34 members of the Band consist of Scouts, Venture Scouts and Scout Leaders.
